There are approximately 600,000 Deaf people in South Africa who primarily use South African Sign Language (SASL), according to a 2024 National Council of and for Persons with Disabilities (NCPD) report. This number is part of a larger group of about 12 million South Africans experiencing varying degrees of hearing loss, with almost 5 million having a hearing disability.
